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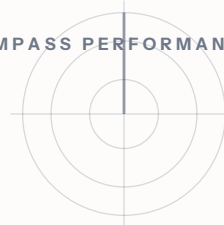

What this is

Improvement moves the result toward the limit of the current design. Only architecture moves the limit. The Compass Enterprise Architecture Engagement is the deliberate design of the operating system an enterprise needs next — how the business decides, allocates capacity, executes and renews.

Who it is designed for

- Enterprises whose growth has outrun the operating design that produced it.
- Leadership teams carrying more priorities than capacity, with decision rights unclear.
- Owners and boards facing a step change — acquisition, integration, a new scale of demand, or transition.
- Executives who want capability transferred, not an advisor permanently in the room.

How the work moves

Five stages. One execution record.

- SEE — read the enterprise as it actually operates, with evidence rather than opinion.
- FOCUS — name the vital few, and decide what stops, defers or is de-invested.
- ARCHITECT — design the operating system: decisions, standards, structure, measures and cadence.
- INSTALL — put the cadence, ownership and measures into live operation with the leadership team.
- TRANSFER — leave the judgment, cadence and decision rights with the client.

- A named strategic intent, with the vital few markets, customers and offerings decided.
- An operating cadence with owners, measures and review dates that survives without Compass.
- Decision rights placed where the information lives, behind written standards.
